GFL's unique ministry opportunities during the pandemic

I would like to share with you some of the things God is doing with Gospel for Life. Our focus is especially on men's ministry and in growing a deliberate disciple-making culture. When we speak at different churches and conferences, we are calling men to rise up above complacency and to consider again the eternal value of consecration and sacrificial commitment to our Lord Jesus Christ. It's amazing to see what happens when men are challenged to fruitful service; they come to understand that sacrifice is normal and comfort is not.

The Lord has been providing some creative ministry opportunities during these times of restricted assembly.

Dedicated men are coming out on Saturday mornings in order to be accountable to one another and to grow spiritually. In addition, at a recent GFL men's seminar this month, a number of spiritual needs came to the surface. I'll share these needs in the form of questions asked by the men:

1.) What is the path to a clear conscience so that I can confess Christ and share the gospel as a lifestyle? 2.) Where does discipleship fit into my growth? 3.) How can I have my private fears addressed when I feel that they are crippling me? 4.) How does assurance of salvation become a crucial factor in risking ministry? It's interesting that in each of these questions, focused discipleship is normally what God uses to move men past blockages to their sanctification.

An additional way the Lord is blessing GFL ministries is by allowing us to write Christian worldview curriculum for a home school group that meets at Grace Community Church. This worldview course is a vital strategy to equip high school students to stand for Christ, and to become competent in responding to our anti-Christian culture. After graduation, many of these students will be attending secular universities, and consequently will be plunged into an atmosphere of secular dogmatism, and moral confusion.

In order to resource these ministries, we depend in part upon the friends of GFL to extend to us a line of support.
