How does discipleship begin?

Life-on-life soul care is the divinely appointed avenue by which we learn to obey all that Christ has commanded (Mt 28:18-20). Disciple-making begins when two or more believers agree to prayerfully study the Word of God together. It is within this committed relational space that spiritual growth thrives. A discipleship relationship can start with an invitation from one Christian to another to form a spiritual partnership for the purpose of maturing in Christ.

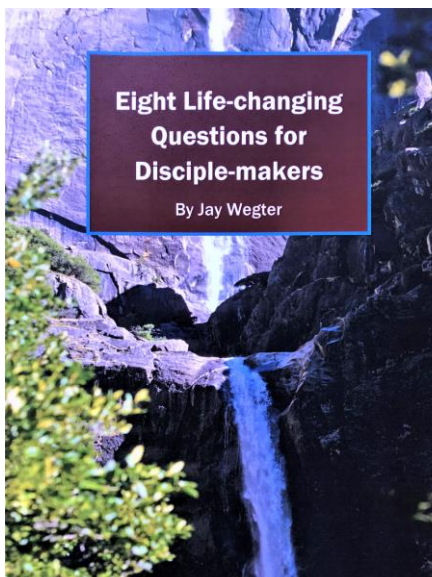

We think you will agree that the eight questions (*chapter titles*) deal with some of the most foundational truths of the Christian's life. Here are the 8 chapter heads:



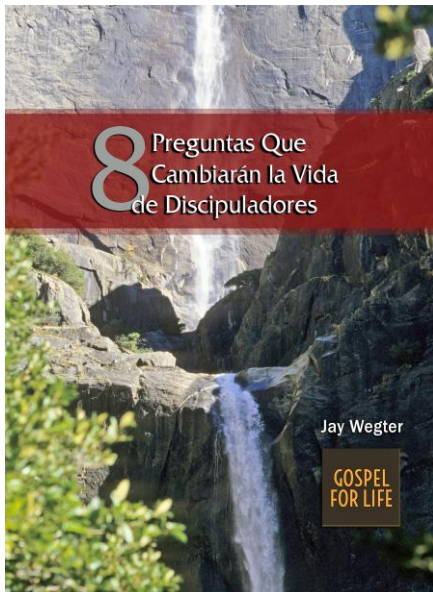
- 1) What is the gospel?
- 2) Why is the gospel sufficient?
- 3) Who has the believer become because of his relationship with Christ?
- 4) What are the believer's spiritual resources because of his relationship with Christ?
- 5) How can a believer live under the control of the Holy Spirit?
- 6) What does it mean to be a true disciple of Christ?
- 7) What does it mean to fulfill the Great Commission?
- 8) How do you make a disciple?

Each of these questions is a kind of gospel summary. And each summary is a compact outline of practical theology that can be adapted to your own format and goals. In addition, progress in understanding and applying the content of these outlines may be used to monitor your disciple's growth and overall comprehension of the gospel.
